2023 was a year of great hardship and prosperity in southern Haiti. Our Haitian friends faced continued gang violence, political unrest and economic upheaval. And against all odds, our teams and the communities we serve still managed to make significant advancements in every area of our Social Support Model's Five Pillars — Empowerment, Education, Nutrition, Healthcare and Infrastructure (formerly Housing), ultimately moving them closer to realizing their independence and self-reliance.

If we had to attribute one word to our collective efforts in 2023, the word *progress* quickly rises to the top. Merriam-Webster defines progress as a *forward or onward movement; a gradual betterment*. This, my friends, is exactly what you've helped accomplish (and what we've witnessed) over the last year. The following represent only a small portion of the many incredible milestones we accomplished together.



children actively reunified

The safety and well-being of the children in southern Haiti is at the top of Overture's priority list. We've seen over **250 children** from the ESPWA orphanage reunited with their families and now, more than three years later, ALL remain together and are moving toward independence and self-reliance. During 2023, we've continued our commitment to remove children from harmful orphanage environments by launching the reunification process with **63 children from two orphanages** to place them into the safety of their own families or with qualified foster families in the first half of 2024.

With your help this past year, 25 of the 63 children who will soon be placed with their biological or foster families were safely evacuated from a dangerous environment after their But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." orphanage was invaded by gangs. The ESPWA campus has provided them with crisis care including nutrition, psychosocial support, medical care, education and protection.

Overture is also continuing our ongoing support of the 250+ reunited children and their families to implement our Social Support Model in their communities so they can be equipped for long-term success. We've seen amazing progress with these families who are embracing the opportunity to move closer to independence and self-reliance.



IBESR partnership formalized

Another family-centered milestone in 2023 was our work to formalize a partnership with IBESR, Haiti's child social services agency. In collaboration with IBESR, we're working to build and expand the foster care system in southern Haiti. In the recent past, the foster care system in the region was only a vision. Together, we're identifying dozens of families who are willing to participate in the vetting process, and if approved, be trained and equipped to become foster parents. This is a huge step forward in creating an alternative to the destructive orphanage system that is so prevalent in Haiti today.

Our team has worked relentlessly to identify and train qualified foster families who can provide a safe and loving home for children. This is especially important for children Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance.

Dory Dome Community Center completed

Just as we focused on strengthening families last year, we also focused on strengthening communities with strong infrastructure that supports and empowers them. One of our most significant milestones is completing a Dome Community Center in Dory, a community of Maniche. This community center is made up of two block-built, disaster-resistant domes and public hygiene/toilet facilities. This investment not only provided new infrastructure, it also created economic opportunities such as paid employment and job skills training for the community members involved in building them.

The dome center is ready to facilitate critical educational, training and community-building programs focused on parenting, leadership and health. We firmly believe that one of the most effective ways to build up a child is to build up the family, and one of the most effective ways to build up a family is to build up their community. This community center is quickly proving to be a model for others in the region seeking to strengthen their own communities. And it is providing hope in Haiti for progress, independence and self-reliance in the face of widespread disorder.

It's been nearly four years since we officially transitioned ESPWA from an orphanage to a thriving community center. It is now a campus where Overture offers a variety of programs focused on empowering families, communities and the local economy in southern Haiti toward independence and self-reliance. And with each passing year, this campus of hope continues to fuel transformational impact that will have lasting influence on generations to come.

Linden's reunification story

Linden (alias name used to protect identity) has lived six of his seven years of life in an orphanage. His parents were 17 when he was born and did not have the psychosocial means or financial resources to care for a child. The overwhelming weight of their circumstances led Linden's mother to abandon him at four months old.

Sadly, she has never tried to reconnect with her son. His father and grandparents, on the other hand, who made the heart wrenching decision to place Linden in the orphanage before his first birthday in hopes for a better way of life, have regretted their decision since day one, but felt like they had no other choice.

Fast forward six years to today. Thanks to the Lord's faithfulness, and to both our strategic partnership with IBESR and our family reunification program which will provide Linden's family with a three-year individualized support plan, Linden was successfully reunited with his biological father and grandparents in January 2024. Let us rejoice!

Throughout the entire reunification process, Linden's family has shown their great joy and desire to bring their child home after several grueling years of separation. During our many visits with the family in preparation for his reunification, Linden's grandmother shared: "I am so glad our child is coming home. We want to see him living with us. I feel so happy! Only God in heaven could tell you how my heart feels right now after seeing Linden."

There is absolutely nothing that compares to seeing the smiles on a child and a parent's face when they are reunited. Stories like Linden's are the driving force behind why we do this work and why we will continue to do it for as long as the Lord allows.

Linden's support plan:

TRAINING AND COUNSELING

Family counseling and parental training sessions will ensure proper child care and protection.

HOUSING

The construction of a new home will ensure proper living conditions for their family.

EDUCATION

Full school scholarships (and associated costs) will be covered for Linden and his siblings.

ECONOMIC SUPPORT

Guidance with developing the family's agriculture and livestock resources will help provide a future source of income.
